## Sutron Books \$4,114,508 in April & Receives \$2,500,000 (Ceiling Price) IDIQ Contract from USBR

May 4, 2009, Sterling, VA.... Sutron Corporation (NASDAQ:STRN), a leading provider of hydrological, meteorological and oceanic monitoring products, systems, software and services, today announced that during April the company received bookings totaling \$4,114,508 and an Indefinite Delivery-Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) Contract from the US Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) with a ceiling price of \$2,500,000.

Sutron's India Operation (SIO) signed a contract with a value of \$2,978,635 (based upon 49.8 Rupees per US Dollar) with the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University to supply, install and maintain 224 Automatic Weather Stations. The project will be completed by December 31, 2009. SIO also received a \$110,000 Annual Maintenance Contract from the Government of Andhra Pradesh to maintain Automatic Weather Stations supplied by Sutron in 2003.

Also during April, the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation awarded to Sutron a three-year IDIQ contract with a ceiling price of \$2,500,000 and issued the first Task Order, valued at \$143,520, for Hydrologic Database Technical Support Services. Additionally, the company's ILEX Division received a Purchase Order from NOAA's Satellite Operations Facility to provide software enhancements valued at \$34,220.

Sutron's Integrated Systems Division received a work order from the State of New Mexico for \$96,000 to supply and install four complete stream gauging stations. In addition, the State of New Mexico increased funding for projects to be completed by Sutron from \$300,000 to \$1,700,000, extending the expiration date to December 31, 2010.

The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) contracted with Sutron's Hydrological Services Division (HSD) to perform work orders valued at \$106,628 to install hydrological monitoring and control equipment.

Other purchase orders, work orders and contracts included supply and installation of seven Hydro-Met Stations for Kenya's Meteorological Department valued at \$140,000; the supply of a GOES Central Receive Station for Venezuela's Meteorological Department valued at \$105,052 ; and several smaller orders from a variety of customers.
