

U.S. FISH & WILDLIFE FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM

Sutron developed and installed a flood warning system for the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service outside Lawton, Oklahoma.

This system consists of several rainfall and water level monitoring stations linked to a master base station via LOS radio for the purpose of data collection, real-time system monitoring, and early flood warning alerts.

The system software developed by Sutron monitors for alarm conditions and disseminates warnings via dial-out voice messaging, and a local siren. This software package allows the user to view real-time trends of data for any particular remote station.
